

Clematis: Their Seasons of Bloom

- 1) Evergreen species, blooming very early:

winter & spring: <i>cirrhusa</i> and cultivars	early spring: <i>armandii</i> and cultivars
winter: <i>napaulensis</i> (summer dormant)	New Zealand species and hybrids

- 2) Deciduous species: blooming on old wood starting in March and April:

C. alpina, koreana var. carunculosa, columbiana, japonica, koreana, macropetala, montana & its cultivars

- 3) Large-flowered hybrids that bloom starting in late April and May on last year's growth, for example:

all double LFHs	'Lady Caroline Nevill'

- 4) Large-flowered Hybrids that bloom in June or later on the current year's growth, for example:

'Ascotiensis'	'Margaret Hunt'

'Hagley Hybrid'	'Perle d'Azur'
'Huldine'	'Rouge Cardinal'
'Jackmanii'	'Star of India'

- 5) Climbing small-flowered hybrids and North American species blooming on-new wood, for example:

<i>Clematis viticella</i> & cultivars: 'Abundance' 'Alba Luxurians' 'Etoile Violette' 'Kermesina' 'Madame Julia Correvon' 'Mikelite' 'Polish Spirit' 'Venosa Violacea'	<i>C. texensis</i> & cultivars: 'Duchess of Albany' 'Gravetye Beauty' 'Princess Diana' <i>C. crispa, pitcheri, viorna</i> Orientalis/Tangutica group <i>C. terniflora</i>

- 6) Summer blooming herbaceous perennial clematis (non-climbing), for example :
